

Inti Knitwear

Social conditions Since the beginning Inti Knitwear has primarily worked with producer groups in Ecuador that mainly consist of women. Every producer group has its leader and Inti works closely together with these leaders, having periodic meetings in Ecuador to understand Inti's requirements and to discuss the details of production. This working method works exceptionally well in countries like Ecuador, and in this case Inti Knitwear has created working opportunities for the local communities with significant focus on women.

However there is no social monitoring or certification system included in the MADE-BY Benchmark for Social Standards that is applicable to control/verify the case of their producer group.

Environmental conditions In 2009 Inti Knitwear only worked with wool originating from the Merino sheep (Class E) and Alpaca, and they have also integrated organic wool originating from Peru for its belt collection. The small amount of Class D (2%) is due to the usage of poly-acrylic. Together Alpaca and organic wool is calculated as 29% of the total collection, but unfortunately due to insufficient information available, these two fibres cannot yet be classified in the MADE-BY Environmental Benchmark for Fibres.

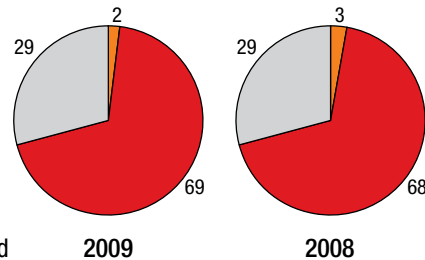
