

# Jackpot

**Social conditions** As a member of the BSCI monitoring and qualification system, Jackpot has worked towards having 2/3rds of its suppliers compliant to the BSCI standards. 16% of their suppliers were already successfully audited against the BSCI standards. This is a small improvement compared with 2008.

The Jackpot team, supported by Solidaridad and MADE-BY, worked intensively over the past two years to help one of their key suppliers in China become BSCI compliant. It is expected that compliancy will be reached within a short period of time. Additionally, Jackpot selected two additional SA8000 certificated suppliers with whom they are building long term relationships for some of their bigger programmes. In addition, one supplier obtained WRAP certification.

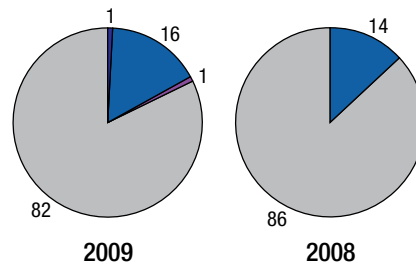
**Environmental conditions** Around 70% of Jackpot's collection was made with cotton in 2009. Jackpot substituted around 26% of this volume for organic cotton (Class B), which is more than double than the 2008 figure (12%). This high percentage was achieved by integrating organic cotton into a much wider range of products. Much of the organic cotton comes from the Chetna project initiated by Solidaridad.

Jackpot also started to integrate other sustainable fibres into their collection, such as Tencel® (Class B) and organic linen (Class A). In 2009, Jackpot replaced 22% of the conventional linen with organic linen used in trousers, dresses and jackets. [www.made-by.org](http://www.made-by.org) In addition to sourcing organically, Jackpot is also working on improving the dyeing, printing and finishing processes in their chains by implementing the GOTS standard. Currently 4 of their key suppliers are GOTS certified.

% of total collection

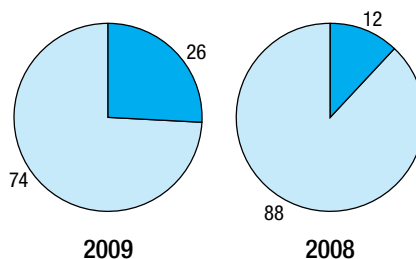

% of total cotton collection

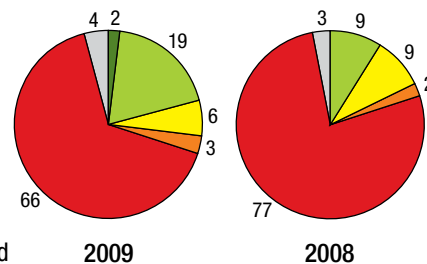
- organic / in conversion
