

# Kidscase

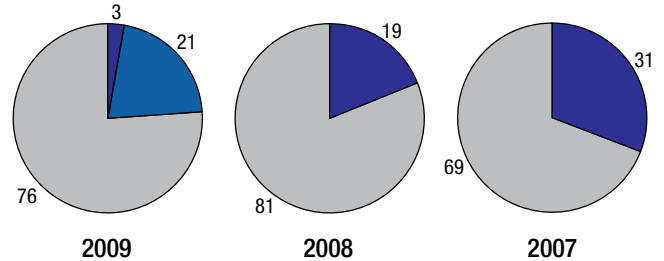
**Social conditions** In 2009, Kidscase shifted the production of their baby collection to a new Indian supplier who not only works with organic cotton but also has successfully passed the BSCI audit. This represents 21% of all items produced. The 3% shown as Class A stand for the production in Europe (Portugal) which is considered a low risk country. Kidscase will continue to encourage the remaining unclassified suppliers to start a social compliance programme. These unclassified suppliers represent 76% of the total production in 2009 compared to 81% in 2008. To make sure more items will be produced under good social conditions, Kidscase will be working with another new supplier for their 2010 collection onwards which is SA8000 certified.

**Environmental conditions** In 2009, a large part of the Kidscase collection was made of cotton (70%), out of which Kidscase produced 71% with organic cotton compared to 28% in 2008. This means that Kidscase tripled the amount of organic cotton used from 2008 to 2009. This increase was a result of shifting the production of more baby items to a new Indian organic cotton supply chain. Kidscase also increased the amount of conventional linen used in their collection which results in a 6% share of Class C. For 2010, Kidscase is aiming to continue this growth path by replacing even more conventional cotton with organic cotton including their woven items.

% of total collection

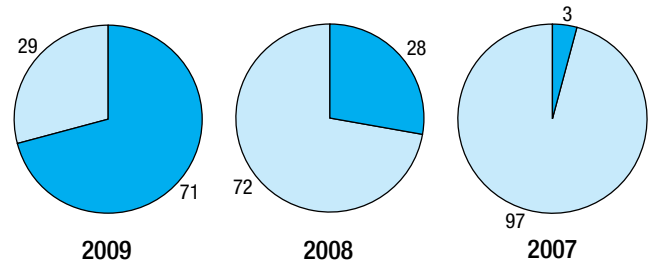

% of total cotton collection

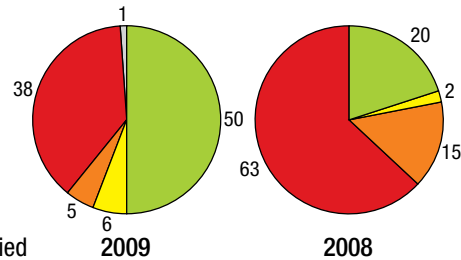
- organic / in conversion
